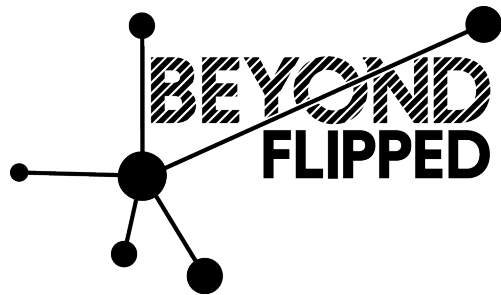


# Lego-A-Go-Go Factual Cheat Sheet



There are 915,103,765 possible combinations for six two-by-four LEGO bricks.

Lego-A-Go-Go stems from Lego Serious Play methodology. LEGO Serious Play was open sourced in 2010 and is used by big business to develop real-time strategic planning.

A LEGO brick from 1958 would interlock with a brick from 2017.

LEGO is a combination of the two Danish words 'leg godt' and simply means 'play well'.

Over 5.2 million LEGO bricks are produced per hour.

13 LEGO sets have been in space on board the International Space Station.

Each LEGO minifigure is exactly four bricks high without a hat.
